



# Andrew Moore Hastings High School Hastings Area School System

As the Director of 8-12 Grade Choirs in the Hastings Area School System since August 2019, Andrew is tasked with recruiting and maintaining a choral program that provides meaningful and high-quality music education to students at every level of musicianship. He directs 5 curricular choirs, the musical, and is starting an extracurricular choir, a student conducting program, and a 3rd-5th grade choir for students from five local elementary schools. He also is a Choral Scholar at Park Congregational Church in Grand Rapids. A graduate of Olivet Nazarene University, Andrew is enrolled in the Michigan State University Summer Masters in Choral Conducting program and will use the scholarship funds to continue his studies with an anticipated 2023 graduation.

**MSU Vocal Arts Outreach Cabaret!** 

Since 2016, our MSU Vocal Arts Outreach Cabaret has performed for a number of schools throughout Michigan. (we performed virtually during COVID)

Our "Bizet to Berstein" Cabaret presents four MSU Graduate students performing Opera Arias, Duets and Quartets as well as Music Theater, Spirituals and the Music of their own diverse backgrounds. Our Finale, "Sit Down You're Rockin' the Boat" from Guys and Dolls, includes your students singing with the MSU singers( it's a very truncated version of this) No rehearsal is necessary on the part of the students -we go through it quickly during the show. The Cabaret is approximately 40 min of music with a Q & A after. Time can be adjusted based on the needs of your schedule and there is no fee for this. The Cabaret is primarily for High School Vocal Music

Students but we also can include Middle School Students. Our singers introduce their selections to give a bit of background before performing. We also have images which can be projected on a screen, a program with singers' bios and translations and a teacher's study guide. I also request feedback from both you and your students so we know how the students are responding to our show.

We offer the Cabaret for both the Fall and Spring semesters and can begin in October in the Fall and

January in the Spring.

#### For your students:

#### **EMU High School Honor Choir- New Event!** November 4-5, 2022

Send a select group of your high school singers to the campus of EMU for a unique experience of high-level choral artistry. High schools may only send balanced quartets at the recommendation of the choir teacher.

#### **EMU Invitational Choral Festival** November 22, 2022

Would you like your students to have the opportunity to work with me, the EMU Choir, and a Guest Composer? I am still in discussion with the composer so I can't announce at this time who will be joining us.

This event is open to all SATB across Michigan and Ohio. You do not need to be selected as a soloperforming ensemble to join us for this outstanding day of choral music. All attending choruses will combine to make a large Festival Chorus and will spend the day learning from our outstanding guest clinician. Individuals and quartets from schools are also encouraged to participate.

In addition, we will invite several of the most accomplished high school choral ensembles to give a solo performance on the Pease Auditorium Stage. Each participating ensemble will receive a private master class with Dr. Brandon Johnson and will join the EMU Festival Honor Choir for a day of music-making with our festival composer.
