

Viable and Versatile Alternatives to 3-Part Mixed, SAB, and SATB Music

Viable and versatile alternatives to the standard choral voicings of 3part mixed, SAB and SATB provide choral directors with a more expanded harmonic palate. These alternative voicings also provide choral singers with opportunities to sing music that will challenge and expand their listening and vocal palates beyond what they might expect. Rehearsal strategies and music examples of alternative voicings specific for MS/HS adolescent voices will be shared with participants while also discussing the versatility of these voicings as opportunities to expand our choir's repertoire.



Rehearsing Vocal Jazz - Idiosyncrasies of the Genre

Teaming up with Michael Wheaton and members of his Northern Singers from Forest Hills Northern High School, this session will bridge the gap between a practicum and a lecture session. We will rehearse a piece or two of actual jazz repertoire with the sextet and break down some of the harmony, rhythm, and articulations that make vocal jazz music unique. Similarly, we will explore ways in which teaching vocal jazz is exactly the same as the choral classroom. The goal is to have each participant, regardless of their comfortability with teaching vocal jazz, ready to dip their toes in the genre with their ensembles this upcoming year.



A Shorthand for Success: Using IPA Hand Signs to Build Choral Blend

American Sign Language is quickly becoming one of the most prevalent foreign languages in schools across the nation. The International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) is one of the most practical tools singers can use to identify the sounds of languages. Combining these facts with James Asher's language teaching method (TPR), this session will give you a "hands on" introduction to using IPA Hand Signs in the choral classroom. Covering warmups, repertoire, and assessment, you'll leave with practical ideas on how to tap into the kinesthetic intelligence of IPA Hand Signs and help foster a unified sound in your choir. It's a shorthand for success because these skills can applied to every language you teach!

Choral Student Leadership Conference



132 students from 21 MSVMA high schools attended the 2022 MSVMA Choral Student Leadership Conference at Michigan Student University on June 22. Students and their choral directors were led through a day of thoughtful discussion and engaging conversation by Dr. Matthew Arau, author of *Upbeat! Mindset, Mindfulness, and Leadership in Music Education and Beyond* and founder of Upbeat Global, is an Associate Professor of Music and the Chair of the Music Education Department and Symphonic Band Conductor at the Lawrence University Conservatory of Music in Appleton, Wisconsin.

Key elements of Dr. Arau's "Upbeat" Leadership Conference were:

The POWER of the UPBEAT...The upbeat is the preparation for any event with your thoughts being the upbeat to your actions.

The POWER of G.E.T.. Gratitude, Enthusiasm and Treasure
The POWER of HABIT...We create habits from repeated actions and behavior
4 C;s of "Upbeat" Leadership...Character, Competence, Connection and Clarity

Students spent time in large and small groups where they were able to make connections with students from around the state who share the same love and passion for being a part of a choral ensemble/family. Conversations about key topics of "Upbeat" leadership were discussed as well as strategies for how each student leader can have a positive impact on those around them.


