MSVMA will be featuring Dr. Derrick Fox as our 2023 MMC Headliner. Dr. Fox is not a stranger to Michigan as during his time attending Michigan State University he served as a highly sought clinician and festival adjudicator.

Dr. Fox will be presenting three different sessions with the focus on Diversity and Inclusion in Action as well as participate in the "Meeting of the Minds" panel discussion.

Dr. Derrick Fox is the Director of Choral Activities and Distinguished Associate Professor of Music at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. He earned a BME from Arkansas State University, a MM in Choral Conducting from the University of Missouri – Columbia and a DMA in Choral Conducting from Michigan State University, where he was awarded the prestigious University Enrichment Graduate Fellowship. Dr. Fox has taught at the middle school, high school and collegiate levels. His conducting experiences have included singers from upper elementary choirs through collegiate and community choirs. Recently, he was awarded the 2021 Bryan R. Johnson Service Award by the Nebraska Music Educators Association and the 2022 University of Nebraska Omaha Award for Distinguished Research/Creative Activity.

Dr. Fox has conducted all state choirs, led international, national and regional choral concerts/residencies and presented professional development workshops across the United States and internationally. His professional workshops focus on assessment in the choral classroom, building classroom community, rehearsal strategies, choral conducting techniques and shape note singing in the African American community. Dr. Fox has held teaching residencies and workshops at the Latvian Academy of Music, Syracuse

University, Michigan State University and the University of Missouri - Columbia. He has also led performance tours through Lithuania and Estonia. In 2019, he conducted National ACDA Middle School/Junior High Mixed Honor Choir and traveled to South Africa as a 2019 ACDA International Conductor Exchange Fellow where he led choral workshops and rehearsals in Johannesburg, Pretoria and Potchefstroom. His recent engagements include presentations at Choral Canada's Podium Conference, the National Federation of Ghanian Choirs Inaugural Choral Conference and the Public Administration Theory International Conference in Mexico; as well as conducting all state choirs in Oregon, Wyoming, Georgia, Kansas, South Carolina and Virginia.

As a baritone soloist, Dr. Fox has collaborated with various organizations; among them are the Arkansas Symphony, Lansing Symphony, St. Louis Symphony, Columbia Chorale, the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Omaha Symphonic Chorus, University of Missouri, Michigan State University, Webster University and the Espaço Cultural (Brasilia, Brazil). He can be heard singing selections from Gershwin's Porgy and Bess on the compact disc In This Hid Clearing, available on the Naxos Classical Music label.

As an author, Dr. Fox has written articles for many organizations and was a contributing author in the Hal Leonard/McGraw Hill choral textbook Voices in Concert. His compositions and arrangements are published by Hal Leonard and Brilee Music. His book, Yes You Can: A Band Director's Guide to Teaching Choirs is published by Carl Fischer. He launched The Derrick Fox Choral Series with Music Spoke to publish works by and about marginalized and minoritized people. He created the Professional Choral Collective (PCC) to collect and create learning activities and teaching strategies for choral music educators around the world to use during the 2020 Coronavirus virus pandemic and beyond. He also partnered with the Country Music Association Foundation to create the Unified Voices for Music Education Initiative which provides learning activities for instrumental and elementary music educators.

Dr. Fox serves on the advisory board for the Sound Spirit, a research lab and publishing initiative promoting collaborative engagement with the songbooks that sound America's musical landscape. He is also a member of the advisory board for the Choral Singing in America documentary series.

Both new and experienced choral conductors can benefit from observing or conducting.

Repertoire for the Conducting Symposium will include "Earth Song", Frank Ticheli; "Ukrainian Alleluia", Craig Courtney and "Day of Fire and Sun", Dom DiOrio. Registration for this can be found in the conference registration. Communication will be sent to those who have signed up to participate at conductors with details regarding music selection.

All-State Music Theatre Honors Ensemble

MSVMA is proud to announce the return of the MSVMA All-State Music Theatre Honors Ensemble, which will be directed by Catherine A. Walker from the University of Michigan!

Twenty students will be selected to perform in the MSVMA All-State Music Theatre Honors Ensemble with rehearsals on January 18 (Grand Rapids, MI) and May 11 (East Lansing, MI) and an evening performance on May 11 at the MSVMA All-State Festival. Students who have received a First Division (I) Rating at the MSVMA Music Theatre Solo and Ensemble Festival are eligible to audition for this special opportunity!

The audition form and the audition video must be submitted by midnight on December 31st. In order to audition, students will need to pay a \$25, non-refundable audition fee. See the directions and link below.

Students must complete all requirements listed on the application (<u>CLICK HERE FOR APPLICATION</u>) and submit (within the form) a 32 bar cut of your musical theatre solo in an unlisted youtube video by December 31, 2022 to be considered. If selected, you will be working with skilled clinicians to create a powerful musical theatre performance representing the best MT students in the state of Michigan. Students will be screened by a panel of judges.

If selected, you will be attending an all-day rehearsal workshop on January 18, 2023 at the Michigan Music Conference in Grand Rapids and an all-day rehearsal on Thursday, May 11, 2023 at the MSVMA All-State Festival followed by a performance at the Thursday night All-State Festival Gala concert.

Remember, the deadline to complete the application for this amazing opportunity is 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2022.

Information for students to participate in this exciting event can be accessed through the Verdi Opera's website at **Verdi Opera Theatre**

Advance information is being sent to Michigan high school vocal music teachers, as well as to private music teachers and other related entities to encourage participation in this prestigious competition which has earned a reputation as the oldest and one of the top vocal competitions for young student vocalists in our state.

The deadline to submit student entries is February 18, 2023. Ten finalists will be selected, and will perform live at the Concert of the Finalists, to be held at the Italian American Club of Livonia, on Sunday, April 30, 2023 at 4 p.m.

The winner of the Competition will receive \$1,000, and all the finalists will receive a monetary prize and other valued support. Most importantly, every participant in the competition will be able to explore the wonderful world of classical Italian songs and opera arias to test their talent in this challenging art form.

The Verdi Opera's commitment is to encourage and assist the development of young vocal music students through our annual vocal competition, by awarding scholarship prizes, and by providing opportunities for these emerging young talents to perform at our concerts. On Tuesday, November 15, 115 high school singers from 5 Flint area high schools joined forces with a professional chamber orchestra and soloists to perform Mozart's Coronation Mass. With the help of 4 mini grants from MSVMA, Flushing, Davison, Grand Blanc and Swartz Creek high school choirs were able to pool the money to hire the professional orchestra to make this event a memorable one for all the singers.

Performing a Choral Masterwork allows students a completely different singing experience that involves collaboration, proximity to professionals and a different genre than what usually is performed at their regular concerts. The high light of this concert was seeing the satisfaction on their faces as they successfully nailed the Credo of this mass which is the most challenging.
