Eligibility

MSVMA welcomes high school students to participate in its Musical Theatre Solo and Ensemble Festivals. Participants must be enrolled and in good standing in their school's vocal music program. Their school must be a member of MSVMA.

Registration and Audition Requirements

Students are required to provide a URL address to a YouTube video for the audition. Singers should perform 32 measures of a musical theater song, preferably accompanied. Any problems with submissions should be reported to lynciechanski@msvma.org b efore the deadline of September 20 at 11:59 p.m.

Fees

The fee of \$65, must be paid via credit card according to instructions students will receive via email upon acceptance.

Registration

MSVMA welcomes middle and high school students to participate in its Musical Theatre Solo and Ensemble Festivals. Participants must be in 7th-12th grade, enrolled and in good standing in their school's vocal music program. Student's school must be a member of MSVMA. Soloists, duets, and ensembles (up to 20 performers) are eligible to participate.

Our Chamber Festivals encourage ensemble singing and sharing of ensemble literature. These non-adjudicated events provide a concert arena for performance by middle, junior and high schools. Participating ensembles share and learn together and from each other.

The number of participants in each group should reflect the character and style of ensemble music. The recommended quideline is between 4 and a

Ensembles that do not attend the Festivals as listeners are subject to sanctions from Festivals by the MSVMA Board of Directors.

MSVMA will welcome singers in grades 7-12 to our Vocal Jazz Intensive (VJI) on October 20 at Forest Hills Fine Arts Center. We are delighted to have an incredible panel of clinicians from around the state, including Duane Davis and All-State Conductor April Tini, to help students and teachers learn about vocal jazz. Morning sessions will include topics on improvisation, circle singing, jazz warm-ups, and jazz vocal technique.

Students will rehearse with clinicians, perform, and participate in a variety of topic sessions. In addition, students will have the opportunity to sing two pieces on the evening concert as part of a mass choir. Teachers may choose to bring an entire ensemble and can perform as a group on the evening concert as well.

Participation in the VJI is highly encouraged for students interested in auditioning for the All-State Vocal Jazz Choir. One of the audition songs will be learned during the afternoon of the VJI.

Eligibility

MSVMA welcomes students to participate in its Vocal Jazz Intensive and All-State Vocal Jazz Program. Participants must be enrolled and in good standing in their school's vocal music program. Their school must be a member of MSVMA.

Application and Audition Requirements

There are no audition requirements! VJI is a day to learn about and sing vocal jazz, regardless of experience. We encourage students who are interested in singing jazz to attend and bring their knowledge back to their school program. The experience also will prepare students for the All-State Jazz Honors Choir audition and encourage participation in All-State Jazz even if they do not regularly sing vocal jazz in their school programs.
